





Several weeks ago, we sent teams into southeast Kearney – the first of several visits we intend to make. We went out with a simple message. Our attempt was not to convert or cajole, just to listen. After introducing ourselves ('We're from Family of Christ Lutheran, and plan to build out where that sign is on Ave M'), we asked a question: what could we pray for in the community or in your household?

Yes, there were moments of silence – but a vast number of the houses we visited started to share: *thanksgivings for family, prayers for healing, concerns for neighbors who were struggling, some history of their own faith journeys.* We really didn't intend to say much about Family of Christ; we listened to them and brought their concerns back to our congregational prayers. Yet most were curious and genuinely glad that a church is planning to build in the neighborhood.

During these days of polarizing and politicizing issues, I wondered if someone was going to ask "what does your church think about <u>fill in the blank</u> (sexuality issues, health care, racism, etc)? Yet seldom did any of the 'hotbutton' issues come up. Most were obviously appreciative to talk about their own difficulties in the road of life with someone willing to listen. Maybe people are tired of being *canvassed* and *surveyed*, or *fractured into parties and ideologies*. By and large, many are busy with their own struggles and journeys to be faithful –to their family, Lord, job and community.

It was usually after sharing their own concerns that the question would be asked, "what church are you from?" Yes, there is *hunger* for community that will encourage us all in healing, faithfulness, reconciliation, hope, forgiveness and peace. AND we plan to risk doing this again. Interested in being part of Jesus' ongoing 'sending disciples out?'

Several of the Gospel lessons during July will remind us of Jesus sending out the disciples in pairs to surrounding cities. His instructions told them to go out with simplicity: no tracts or messages, no condemnations or invitations, and welcome the hospitality of the community. If they were not well received, 'shake the dust off their shoes' and continue forward. But they were to bring the *good news of the kingdom*'s *presence* with peace and healing. The disciples returned, we are told, with excitement at what they heard and

#### PASTORAL LETTER FROM BISHOP EATON

BISHOP ELIZABETH EATON, presiding Bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America wrote this letter to congregations on the recent tragedies in Charleston, S.C.

It has been a long season of disquiet in our country. From Ferguson to Baltimore, simmering racial tensions have boiled over into violence. But this ... the fatal shooting of nine African Americans in a church is a stark, raw manifestation of the sin that is racism. The church was desecrated. The people of that congregation were desecrated. The aspiration voiced in the Pledge of Allegiance that we are "one nation under God" was desecrated.

Mother Emanuel AME's pastor, the Rev. Clementa Pinckney, was a graduate of the Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary, as was the Rev. Daniel Simmons, associate pastor at Mother Emanuel. The suspected shooter is a member of an ELCA congregation. All of a sudden and for all of us, this is an intensely personal tragedy. One of our own is alleged to have shot and killed two who adopted us as their own.

We might say that this was an isolated act by a deeply disturbed man. But we know that is not the whole truth. It is not an isolated event. And even if the shooter was unstable, the framework upon which he built his vision of race is not. Racism is a fact in American culture. Denial and avoidance of this fact are deadly. The Rev. Mr. Pinckney leaves a wife and children. The other eight victims leave grieving families. The family of the suspected killer and two congregations are broken. When will this end?

The nine dead in Charleston are not the first innocent victims killed by violence. Our only hope rests in the innocent One, who was violently executed on Good Friday. Emmanuel, God with us, carried our grief and sorrow - the grief and sorrow of Mother Emanuel AME church - and he was wounded for our transgressions – the deadly sin of racism.

I urge all of us to spend a day in repentance and mourning. And then we need to get to work. Each of us and all of us need to examine ourselves, our church and our communities. We need to be honest about the reality of racism within us and around us. We need to talk and we need to listen, but we also need to act. No stereotype or racial slur is justified. Speak out against inequity. Look with newly opened eyes at the many subtle and overt ways that we and our communities see people of color as being of less worth. Above all pray – for insight, for forgiveness, for courage.

## Family of Christ Council Meeting Minutes....June 09, 2015

Pastor John opened with a devotion that included that video shown during church service on June 7<sup>th</sup>. President DeBoer called the meeting to order. There were 7 members present. Treasurer Report: the balance sheet and the budget were approved by council.

Pastor Report: Pastor John discussed the door to door outreach near the site of the new church, which was well received. He also shared a conversation with Bill Graves (of Mission Builders) who approached him recently regarding the new church. Bill indicated that the church should begin dialogue with Mission Builders if they intended to use their services. The council agreed to open conversations with Mission Builders regarding the possibility of working together to build the new church. Pastor John discussed adding Kelly Hauff to the list of drivers for church vehicles as a new ministry, which council approved. A new grief curriculum will be acquired to support related ministries. New church members who have completed Inquirer's will be welcomed to the church in July.

Ministries Coordinator report: The report indicated that the Ministries Coordinator would be meeting with the Education Team and Pastor John on new ways to engage members. The Ministries Coordinator report was accepted by council.

New Business: The church council plans to have further discussions for recommendations regarding church vehicle usage. Until that time it is recommended that vehicles be used in town for church business and ministries only. The council also plans to engage in discussion with the capital campaign group at a future council meeting.

Old Business: It was decided that families are welcome to use the church facilities for celebrating birthdays or anniversaries, but the church would not provide funds for the celebration. Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.


