

All 14 participants were welcomed. Lois and Judy moved the picnic to the church basement due to extreme

heat. Grace was shared & picnic lunches were eaten along with lots of personal updates regarding family and friends.

The Business was started by Judy who shared an invitational letter from Midland College received by Sue. The letter challenged us to assist with their goal of \$1 million to provide a Perpetual Chair for a Campus Pastor position. The college had to recently give up their campus pastoral presence due to survival budget cuts. We agreed to send \$25.00, plus half of today's offering. Peggy will ask our FOC Treasurer to prepare a check and she will complete the donation form and send it to Midland College as soon as possible.

The next items of business included 2 Synodical events that our ladies have an opportunity to participate in:


A Saved to Serve opportunity in Hebron, NE, the weekend, July 31 to August 2, at Blue Valley Lutheran Homes; The Registration cost is \$39 and forms with more information are available by the Welca display at FOC and online at the NSWO website. You receive faith growth, WELCA relationships, and a T-shirt.

The 2015 NSWO Biennial Convention is at 1<sup>st</sup> Lutheran Church in Lincoln on Sept. 18-20. The theme and keynote speaker, plus more information is available in "Expressions," the NSWO newsletter which has been placed in the Welca display. Barbara Laursen, one of our PMAs, shared that she usually goes at her own expense. Lois Adamson is interested in being our delegate. We decided to pay the registration fee of \$90 for a delegate. Lois is interested and will keep us posted on her availability.

Annual turnover of 2 Unit Leaders involves an election at our upcoming October 2015 gathering. Judy explained that Lois and Elizabeth Laursen Roesler had originally volunteered to be the Co-Coordinators in January 2015. Lois became the sole Coordinator due to unexpected conflicts with Elizabeth's availability on weekends. Elizabeth will be contacted for the Coordinator position first. Barbara Laursen did offer to take a leadership role in 2016. (For clarification: The 2-year positions of Treasurer and Assistant-Coordinator are available. The Assistant-Coordinator has the opportunity to move into the Coordinator position her second year.)

The New Church was the program topic by Jane David. Jane shared her experience as Council President, getting the Council and Building Committees organized and informed for Stage 1 decisions. She circulated a listing of 19 meetings and site visits that were necessary to buy land south of Highway 30. Final Closing on the land was July, 2013. Also in Phase 1, 4 Committees were formed: Planning & Vision, Communications, Finances, and Site Building. They met and discussions were summarized and publicized. In Phase 2, The Church & Community Self Study has been divided into 4 parts and 4 leaders have been chosen to facilitate each topic: Community Study- Vickie Schaepler, Congregational Study- Stephanie Straatmann, Maps & Demographics- Brad Anderson, and Influential Relationships- RaNae Cernik. In closing, Jane strongly encouraged each of us to get involved if we really want a new church: Talk to the council members, ask to participate on the Capital Campaign team, and/or be more proactive in one of the Church Self Study groups.

It always amazes me that the same young folk who wouldn't wash dishes at Note that have lively 'kitchen parties' together, or that they can live without **A A A A A B** phone or Facebook for a week. Naturally there are some who dive right into the camp atmosphere with delight and excitement; others are more reticent and apprehensive. Regardless, at the end of the week they are all sharing excitedly their highs and lows, with one particular repeated question: did you make it on the high ropes *course*? The picture shows one group of students assisting each other across the gaps between the towers – not for the faint of heart, although very safely done!



Ironman, somewhat repentant of his past selfishness and using all his resources for a reluctant good, could compare with *Jacob* in Genesis. The youthful questioning of identity in Peter Parker (Spiderman) was an echo of Jeremiah's complaint that he was 'just a youth' when God called him. It was a foil to bring the students to study their own personalities and gifts. They would hopefully realize that God calls us each, knows our From there we could talk about the temptations all 'superheros' and saints face: capability of selfishly misusing pow-

strengths and weaknesses, and blesses us with spiritual tools and powers (examples are forgiveness, encouragement, peace, hope). And a little side trip into X Men revealed similarities to the way 1 Corinthians 12 reminds us we are a team, a body of individual parts united under the same head, Christ. "To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good." er; fear and lack of self value; pride and stubbornness; impatience; lack of accountability. Those are examples of what the youth perceived. They then wrote their personal 'confession of temptation', placing it before the One who 'was tempted in every way as we are', Jesus.

The moment that brought me most gratification was when all were drawing symbols of their personal 'strengths and weaknesses'. It could have been a moment of teasing and putdowns, dangerous to young egos. Instead, most were asking for help from their peers: "what do you see is my strength and weakness?" The responses were generally honest and encouraging. Including for me (you can ask me privately what they saw my 'strength and weakness' to be).

Each year at camp, I am reminded that God continues to raise up great and generous gifts in the church, and there's another crop coming along! Then, at the end of the week, I realize it's time to start preparing for next year. Hmm. Maybe we'll do The Hunger Games and the call of Moses.

SUMMER SCHEDULE REMEMBER .. we are in the summer schedule from Memorial Weekend through Labor Dav Weekend! ### **BUILDING UPDATE #1**

Where are we at in the building process on the land at 15<sup>th</sup> and M? We're hoping to give this monthly update to let everyone have information, and offer their availability in helping us in the whole process.

The church council, in the July meeting, had conversation with an ELCA resource for *capital campaigns*, and is considering approval of starting work with Family of Christ in January of 2016. After 3-4 months of planning and training, we could have our campaign to seek 3 year giving commitments totaling \$300,000-600,000. - We are starting conversations with Mission Builders, the ELCA group that has volunteer contractors and builders who assist churches in building. We are discussing construction start in spring of 2017.
- Jane David is leading teams of volunteers from the congregation to pull together information for the Mission Investment Fund (the agency we would be borrowing from for the estimated \$1.5 million). This study analyzes our congregational life, the community growth of Kearney, and potential ministry plans we have for the future. There being no further business the meeting was adjourned and we closed with the Lord's Prayer.


