BUILDING UPDATE #2


Where are we at in the building process on the land at 15th and M? In this month's update, The church council approved working with *Stewardship Key Leaders*, associated as an ELCA resource for *capital campaigns*, and have discussed starting their work with us in January of

2016, with a campaign to finish somewhere after Easter (early April)

OUR goal would potentially be raising 3 year giving commitments totaling at least \$600,000. If you would like to assist in this vital component, contact Mike DeBoer (308-230-3458)

- *Mission Builders*, the ELCA group that has volunteer contractors and builders who assist churches in building, are 'penciling' construction start in spring of 2017.
- Jane David *could definitely use willing assistants*, volunteers from the congregation to pull together information for the *Mission Investment Fund* (the agency we would be borrowing from for the estimated \$1.5 million). This study analyzes our congregational life, the community growth of Kearney, and potential ministry plans we have for the future. *Contact Jane if you would like to assist in any of the teams: 293-2466*

September 20: "Regular" Sunday format with classroom for the youngest, gatherings for confirmands and High School.


The adults will start a series on *building churches through the ages* – focus on various aspects of church architecture, the theology represented, and opportunity for discussion on our building plans.

The natural word for our feelings is *grief*. We have shared with these folks in ways that all of us have grown and appreciated new gifts brought into our common Family, and we regret the change distance will bring. Over time, our work together allowed us to explore talents and abilities and experiences that we certainly never predicted.

In fact, most of us in congregational life are little aware of *the first meeting we have together with future friends*. That initial greeting of peace, sharing of a seat, taking time to converse with a stranger *can translate into gracious years* of sharing in God's joys of fellowship. **Take this as an encouragement** to greet, meet and share with those who visit and take time to worship with us – *you never know what kind of future brother or sister in Christ is being nurtured*.

When Abraham (Genesis 22) was faced with change in his life and question about the future possibility, he proclaimed, "God will provide". It's an invitation for us to recognize that God does offer new adventures and promise; it's also a request that we keep our eyes open to the creative ways our Lord grants us new provision.

Thank you, Lord, for allowing us to share in such grace-filled friendships! Help us keep alert to Your provision in the gifts in the people whom we meet.

July 12, 2015 Quarterly Notes

All participants were welcomed. A thank you was expressed that the picnic had been moved to the church basement due to extreme heat. Grace was shared & picnic lunches were eaten along with lots of personal updates regarding family and friends.

THE BUSINESS began with the reading of an invitational letter from Midland College. The letter challenged us to assist with their goal of \$1 million to provide a Perpetual Chair for a Campus Pastor position. The college had to recently give up their campus pastoral presence due to survival budget cuts. We agreed to send \$25.00, plus half of today's offering. Peggy will ask our FOC Treasurer to prepare a check and she will complete the donation form and send it to Midland College as soon as possible.

The 2015 NSWO Biennial Convention is at 1st Lutheran Church in Lincoln on Sept. 18-20. The theme and keynote speaker, plus more information is available in "Expressions," the NSWO newsletter which has been placed in the Welca display. Barbara Laursen, one of our PMAs, shared that she usually goes at her own expense. Lois Adamson is interested in being our delegate. We decided to pay the registration fee of \$90 for a delegate. Lois is interested and will keep us posted on her availability.

The October gathering will include an election of new volunteer leaders. Lois Adamson and Elizabeth Laursen Roesler have been Co-Coordinators. We thanked Lois for being the sole coordinator when Elizabeth was out of town. Barbara Laursen did offer to take a leadership role in 2016. She will be contacted before the Oct. gathering. For clarification, 3 positions need to be filled. A Coordinator position for 1-year, and an Assistant-Coordinator and Treasurer for 2-years. The Assistant-Coordinator moves into the Coordinator position her second year.

THE NEW CHURCH was the program topic by Jane David. Jane shared her Council President experience organizing the Council and Building Committees for Phase 1 decisions. She circulated a listing of 19 meetings and site visits that were necessary to buy land south of Highway 30. Final Closing on the land was July, 2013.

Jane shared that we are yet in Phase 2. Last year 4 teams were formed: Planning & Vision, Communications, Finances, and Site Building. The Church & Community Self Study has been divided into 4 parts and 4 leaders have been chosen to facilitate each topic: Community Study- Vickie Schaepler, Congregational Study- Stephanie Straatmann, Maps & Demographics- Brad Anderson, and Influential Relationships- RaNae Cernik. She printed out a summary of Phase 2, the leaders on the Teams and the Self Study, and key questions. In closing, Jane strongly encouraged each of us to get involved if we truly want a new church: Talk to the council members, ask to participate on the Capital Campaign team, and/or be more proactive in one of the Church & Community Self Study groups.


