


Where are we at in the building process on the land at 15th and M? In this month's update, The council is focusing on the regular processes of the congregational life. We are developing the budget and nomination committees for our January 2016 congregational meeting. You can be a part of that discussion - contact Pr. John or Mike DeBoer. We are setting Sunday, April 17th 2016 as our date to have a capital campaign. OUR goal would potentially be raising 3 year giving commitments totaling at least \$600,000. If you would like to assist in this vital component. contact Mike DeBoer (308-230-3458) The church council approved working with Stewardship Key Leaders, associated as an ELCA resource for capital *campaigns*. They will work with us in February through April as we work on the campaign together. Material for study came in from SKL for our 7 congregational leaders – who will start setting up the process in February. Our response in the capital campaign would give us wisdom (and confidence) to move on the next portions of the building. Our estimates are approaching \$2.5 million for finished building and land.

The budget committee approached the council with concerns about our needs for 2016: we need to clarify our stewardship with the congregation on our financial needs — not just for building, but also for maintaining program. The council decided to discuss this with the congregation during the budget conversations (in January) AND to use our Steward**ship Campaign** as a time to increase all around stewardship growth in the congregation. Your prayerful and generous support is appreciated. 

You probably have already set out some resolutions for With that understanding, I suggest (and I've suggested it

the new year, and maybe have even broken some. The word resolution, while having one sense of *determination* also has another v root in *building a case from basic components*. Think back to **PASTOR'S NOTES** *in the mathematics, where one resolved a puzzle from various specifics.* before-last year!) that we base our new year's resolutions on a simple but profound exercise - remembering whose we are, and what how we are called to live, before we try changing other habits and diets. The simple and profound idea was suggested by Pastor David Lose (whom I've quoted before). "Once every day – and it will be easier if it's the same time each day – look in the mirror and say the following: "I am God's child, deserving of love and respect, and God will use

me to change the world."

From his experience (and mine, too) "these words are actually rather hard to say and even harder to believe. That why we need to do it every day for the rest of the month. Because the first few time you say it, you're likely not to believe it; that is, all those descriptive things about you...will begin to creep in and voice doubts about what you are confessing." Some of those negative messages will be like these: "You, a child of God? But what about your failed job or marriage? What about when you disappointed your parents or children? Yeah, maybe God loves you, but you don't really deserve that love, and you're not in a position to change yourself, let alone the world."

The thing is, all these messages are partially true: we have made mistakes, disappointed the world and ourselves. But what the Christmas message of St. John (read chapter 1 of the Gospel, and all of the letter called 1 John) says is *definitively true* is that Jesus gives each one of us the "power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God." And nothing can change that.

That's good stuff - remembering who you are by nature of God's promise gives the energy and motivation and purpose to fulfill other *resolutions* that are worthy. It also encourages us to consider our living in light of God's will for us and through us.

By the way, elsewhere in this newsletter are a list of opportunities for you to grow in your appreciation as a child of God, and your use of spiritual gifts in the world.

Pastor Report: The Inquirer's Group recently completed a study and we anticipate welcoming some new members to worship with us in the near future!


Ministries Coordinator report: Barb is updating addresses in the Icon Program.


