

Family of Christ Church Council Minutes May 10, 2016

Present: Pastor John Gosswein, Cheryl Hedstrom, Peggy Nelson, Lanny Johnson, John Marsh, Connie Fie. Absent: Lance Knoedler and Chris Denton

The meeting was called to order by Cheryl and prayer and devotions were given by Pastor John with reading from the 21st chapter of Revelations.

April minutes were reviewed. Motion was made for approval (Lanny/John). Minutes carried.

The Financial Report was reviewed and approved. It was reported funeral check was distributed with half to First Lutheran church and half to the FOC Fellowship fund.

A check for \$1100 will be issued to Mike Meier from the building fund and payment to the Mission Investment Fund will be made. The Capital Campaign total expenditures are approximately \$10,000.

PJ report: There are 16 members in the Inquirer's group. They will be meeting over a two month period. Barb has coordinated the suppers.

Ministries Coordinator Report for April was distributed. Barb thanked those who have helped throughout the past month. There is an urgent need for volunteers from the congregation to help with the Care Team. She would also welcome assistance with transporting items to and from functions. Report was approved.

Lanny reported on his meeting with Mission Builders. The tentative date for beginning construction was Summer of 2017. The option of building in phases was discussed and a need to have a resource team look into options as well as projected construction costs.

Pastor John offered a 2-point proposal:

Form a committee to look into creative ways to reach out to the southeast Kearney neighborhood with Wednesday evening programming and outreach activities.

Restructuring of the Capital Campaign committee to consider feasible options going forth with building. Pastor John offered to forward names to Cheryl who will send e-mails inquiring about serving on the committees. Lanny/John made the motion to go forth with the proposal. Motion carried.

Discussion on the Land and Building Fund/Capital Campaign was discussed. Question has been asked if land and building are the same as the capital campaign. Peggy asked if further clarification needs to be made so the congregation knows the Land and Building fund donations are designated for Capital Campaign.

PJ made the motion that all offerings designated henceforward through building or building and land or Capital Campaign will be gathered in a (restricted) account for the Growing and Building in Faith. Motion carried.

PJ asked if a tent could be purchased for use at outdoor activities. PJ will look into purchasing and/or renting.

Meeting was adjourned and closed with the Lord's Prayer.

(Not just) YOUTH TRIP TO MINNESOTA BOUNDARY WATERS



\$500 pays for everything: Voyageurs Canoe experience (outfitting and guide), travel, food (with snack and quick lunch exceptions on Friday the 5^{th} and Saturday the 13^{th}). If you are interested, talk with Pr. John quick!

We leave *Friday August 5th*, stay at a church overnight Friday and Saturday in *Minneapolis/St. Paul*, and arrive at Lutheran Camp Vermillion Sunday afternoon. They escort






