

#### **Family of Christ Council Minutes** September 13, 2016 - 7:00 p.m.

Present: Pastor John; Cheryl Hedstrom, Peggy Nelson, John Marsh, Chris Denton

Absent: Lance Knoedler and Lanny Johnson

Pastor John gave the devotion from Luke Chapter 15.

Minutes: August 9 minutes were read and approved (John/Peggy)

Pastor John's Report: The Boundaries Youth Trip and "God's Work Our Hands" went well. He reported the Mutual Ministries committee meeting with paid staff went well. The Mutual Ministries Committee provided feedback on Pr. John's strengths and weaknesses. Cheryl noted various committees have played a passive role and have let Pastor John take charge. PJ noted he would like the Council members to hold him accountable in his effort to ask people to assist. He would like to see his role as providing guidance with overseeing committees to make sure the members have resources and permission to develop. He sees asking congregants to assist as a positive approach. Worship, Properties and Stewardship are areas to be strengthened.

Revamping of the Care Teams within Fellowship were discussed. Care team chairs are:

Habitat & Jubilee - Peggy Buettner;

Funerals – Nona Svoboda and Joyce Alberts;

Meals to ill, new babies, etc. - Cindy Grabenstein and Barb Laursen;

Lenten and Advent Pot lucks - Jane David, Sandy Tacha, Barbara Sitzman;

Social Events – Lois Adamson;

Ministry Coordinator: Barb Laursen.

There will be 7-10 care teams that rotate when needed. Barb outlined the process. She finds out the details, approximate number and the number of the Care Team that is next on the list and calls the chairs with the information who in turn call those care team members.

Barb provided the Job Description for the Web Resources Person.

Barb asked for clarification of total work hours for Ministries Coordinator. Peggy noted budget records show 10 hours per week (40 hours/month) for Ministries Coordinator and 4 hours per week for Web Resources.

#### Financial Report:

Peggy reviewed the financial report with the Council. Total expenses were \$10,282.29 and net income in the General Fund on August 16 was \$3,101.19.

Capital Campaign funds are deposited in the Mission Investment Fund at the end of each month.

Peggy noted Pastor John will need to review his health plan options. She will bring information to the October

The question was raised as to whether Comfort Care funds are deposited in the general fund or a separate account. After discussion Pastor John (John M) made the motion to establish accounts for Comfort Care and Hole in the Roof Gang on the "Balance Sheet by Class". Motion carried.

Old Business: Nominees to the Stewardship and Budget committees were tabled from the August meeting. Names were suggested for Stewardship and Budget and individuals contacted regarding willingness to serve. PJ asked for the names of the members of last year's nominating committee. Connie will review past minutes to find the individuals who served. He noted congregational representatives to the synod meeting also needs to take place. It was the consensus to drop the trial of Right Now Ministries series.

It was noted Sunday School starts up again September 18. The Council rep for Education, Lance Knoedler, has noted the committee is planning to redevelop the structure to include family participation.

Motion to adjourn was made (PJ/John) at 8:20. Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer







# ReFormation of "Saints and Sinners"

We are approaching a quincentennial.

That is a celebration of 500 years, just a little older than you and me. It's a recognition that the Reformation got it's running legs on October 31, 1517, when Dr. Martin Luther started a debate. On that Hallowed Eve, he didn't claim to have 'all the right doctrines', nor did he promise a 'perfect' church. Instead, his posted articles of debate were a witness to his insights: we are sinners only redeemed through Jesus' merit. Through his reading of

Scripture (especially Romans), he re-stated the message: we are justified by grace. By faith we cling to that promise.

Luther pled with the Church to stop pretending we could buy our way to spiritual contentment – there isn't enough money to buy eternal peace of mind, and you'd feel like you're just deceitfully bribing God anyway.

He invited us to be honest with ourselves – none of us is perfect. When we live with pretense, we either become arrogantly self righteous over each other, or live in despair similar to human damnation.

Luther, imperfect as he was (and there are plenty of evidences of that!), recognized that it wasn't about him, or about you and me. It is about Jesus and grace, giving us the daily re-newal and re-formation to live as God's people.

Fifteen hundred years earlier, the Apostle Paul (who learned the same lesson about 'grace' and 'life') shared it this way in Ephesians 2:

<sup>4</sup>But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, <sup>5</sup>made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved. <sup>6</sup>And God raised us up with Christ and seated us with him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus, <sup>7</sup>in order that in the coming ages he might show the incomparable riches of his grace, expressed in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. 8For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God $^{-9}$ not by works, so that no one can boast.  $^{10}$ For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

We'll sing of this especially on this Reformation Weekend (Oct 29/30). That weekend, we'll be engaging four 9<sup>th</sup> graders on their affirmation of baptismal promises (a.k.a. 'Confirmation''): Avery Collison, Brian Fahnholz, Skyler Krull and Allison Upthagrove. In fact, one of them may receive verse 8 above as their confirmation text. It's not that they are perfect (far from it) or understand all doctrine fully (whoever does can explain the Trinity to me); instead, they are claimed by God as holy ('saints') in the midst of their earthly struggles ('sinners'). As we celebrate with them, we appreciate God's invitation to all of us to be part of this ongoing re-formation and re-newal.




WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY have their Bible study the second week of the month: Monday evening at 7 p.m. all are welcome.
