



In November and December, we have traditionally allowed our *Noisy Offering* gifts to go towards Lutheran World Relief where we purchase barnyard animals for

**SINNERS BEING TRANSFORMED BY THE LOVE OF GOD** "I'm no saint," I've heard people say – and they continue with a mini confession to prove it. Yet as I listen to their litany of human flaws and foibles, I get this sneaking suspicion that they are using the statement as an excuse to give up the struggle. Sometimes it's easier for us to throw in the towel when the battle seems to be harder than we anticipated, or when we don't see things go our way. "I'm no saint" can be a way of covering our embarrassment at not being 'perfect', avoiding the humility of our humanity and excusing ourselves from the responsibility and task.

There are several faulty assumptions about 'saints'. First - that the saints are 'more saintly' (read 'pure/perfect') than us. Dianne Bergant wrote:

Too often saints are depicted as people who are so extraordinary that we could never identify with them. Their commitment to God and virtue is unwavering, their trust in divine providence unshakable, and their unselfish service of others puts everything that we do to shame. Such a depiction is unfortunate, because someone who was not first a genuine human being would probably never grow into the kind of holiness to which we are all called.

To put that another way: these *humans* had to learn this holiness *through their own humility and humanity*. The 'saints' that we acknowledge on All Saints Sunday were not 'perfect'. But we give thanks to God for their ability to reflect an attribute of God's grace in the midst of the tensions of life.

The **second** mistaken impression of 'saints' is that they must have extraordinary courage or self-denial. Most of the catalog of 'saints' would laugh that some thought they had greater character, morality, endurance, or personal character. These saints may be memorialized in stained-glass windows, or in our memories as the simple person who assisted us in our moment of need. Regardless, they would see their moment of 'saintedness' as one where they cooperated with the life of Jesus happening through them. They found God's strength to be forgiving, generous, gracious, caring – all as a reflection of Jesus' love for them.

The book of Revelation reminds us that saints are children of God who 'washed their robes ... in the blood

of the lamb'; this implies that they allowed their lives to be placed in the death and resurrection of Jesus, and they (again, Diane Bergant) "brought the fruits of their baptism to the lives they lived." Thus, I like the image of saints being sinners transformed by God's love. It's not by our work – but through our reflecting that gracious, forgiving, generous, peaceful, joyful, patient, nurturing, encouraging, com-

passionate love of God. In spite of our selves.

"I'm no saint"? Ah, I disagree – for I have seen the grace of God reflected in how you respond to life. I anticipate vou can become that window of God's work in the world.




