The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer. Respectfully submitted, Connie Fie




Christmas Caroling at the Buffalo County Jail





Inclement Weather Policy

We all know how snow or ice can defeat the weatherman's predictions. If we must cancel worship services or activities because of a storm, we will post it on the weather postings (found for example on KGFW or NTV) as soon as possible. *We may not be able to change the* church answering machine which lists the usual service times.



The lovely carol is sometimes misheard as *God* just giving peace to merry gentlemen. But notice the comma, which alters the meaning, turning it into a blessing: God pro-

vide your joy (merry), people!

The holiday season can stir deep emotions within each of us. Many children greet the advent of Christmas with joy and excitement, whereas those who have lost loved ones during the past year may find great sadness in the very same event. Thankfully, our God meets us wherever we are, both physically and emotionally. The Advent stories give voice to the complex situations and emotions with which we greet the coming Messiah and use the reactions of those who first received the news of Jesus' birth (Zechariah, Joseph, Mary, and the shepherds) to do so. These verses acknowledge responses of fear, confusion, doubt, and curiosity, while the coming of Jesus promises comfort and joy for all of us. I have adapted this from a resource (Sunday and Seasons) and invite you to find some time (perhaps one per week) and space (maybe around an advent wreath, lighting one candle each week) to share these verses and prayers.

Week 1: The Angel speaks to Zechariah's fear (read Luke 1:5-20)

These fears could be blessed and exchanged for use as prayer petitions pray.

Week 2: The Angel speaks to Joseph's confusion (read Matthew 1:18-25) **Reflective moment:** create two collages from newspapers and/or magazines—one of confusing world events and one of clarifying and hopeful messages. **Prayer:** O God who brings comfort and joy, when the world baffles us with conflicting messages and puzzling events, speak to our confusion. Comfort us with the knowledge that you are with us in times of clarity and times of confusion. In Jesus' name we pray.

Week 3: The Angel speaks to Mary's doubt (read Luke 1:26-38) the Bible they find the most difficult to believe and what they know to be true.

Week 4: The Angel speaks to the Shepherds' curiosity (read Luke 2:8-20)

Reflection: do some wondering together. Tell the birth narrative by heart, and in the style of Godly Play (www.godlyplayfoundation.org), pose the following questions at the end of the story: "I wonder what part of the story you like best?" "I wonder what part of the story is the most important?" "I wonder what part of this story is especially for you this year?" **Prayer:** O God who brings comfort and joy, when we wait with anticipation of what will come, speak to our curiosity. Comfort us with your surprises and give us hearts that are thankful for all that you provide. In

Jesus' name we pray.

Tidings of Comfort and Joy

Reflective moment: use this time to invite participants to jot their fears anonymously on notecards.

Prayer: O God who brings comfort and joy, when fear overwhelms us and we cannot see a way out, speak to our fear. Calm our troubled hearts and provide peace in our fearful world. In Jesus' name we

Reflective moment: engage those present in a conversation about which articles of faith or passages of

Prayer: O God who brings comfort and joy, when our faith waivers and we question your word, speak to our doubt. Comfort us with your promises and renew our trust in you. In Jesus' name we pray.


