

Family of Christ Lutheran Church Minutes – April 18, 2017

**Present:** Pastor John, John Marsh, Tami Frye; Jane David; Peggy Nelson; Lance Knoedler; David Wiebe, Connie Fie Layne Knoedler and Mike DeBoer.

**Devotion:** Pastor John gave the devotion from Psalm 16 focusing on the security and confidence that God is always there to surround and guide.

March minutes. John M asked for approval of the March minutes. Motion made (Tami/David) to approve. Carried.

**Treasurer's Report**: Peggy reviewed the Statement of Financial Income and Expense for March. Gross profit was \$16,085. Expenses were \$10,358.22 with a net ordinary income of \$5,726.78. Assets show Capital campaign of \$170,158.81; land and building savings of \$40,603.59; emergency funds \$11,201.50; mission investment funds 22,704.03; operating checking of \$69,743.04 with total current assets of \$314,410.97. Total fixed assets are \$750,000. John M. asked for motion to approve the treasurer's report. Motion made (David/PJ) and approved.

**Building Team Report**: Layne Knoedler gave an update from the Building Team. He noted first thing the Team did was to revisit the purpose and goals outlined at the Annual Meeting. This is:

A desire

- to grow our ministries, outreach and our congregation
- to grow our educational opportunities for both youth and adult
- to have larger and more accessible spaces for fellowship activities
- to improve the overall aesthetics, attractiveness and functionality of our building

He reiterated the focus should be what is best for the ministry of Family of Christ. He noted the Team has not discussed financial feasibility of the project. Their purpose is to provide estimates of what it will cost to move the project forward and what the next steps will be. Different approaches to meeting the goals have been discussed from renovations to the existing building and construction of a new building. One of difficulties with the process has been coming up with estimated costs. Invitation was given to three contractors to submit estimates for the project. Until a formal set of blueprints are drawn up it will be very difficult to get a realistic estimate of the cost. Infrastructure issues need to be addressed. Motion was made (Pastor John/Jane) to have formal blue prints drawn up with the cost not to exceed \$2000. Motion carried. A congregational meeting early summer is planned to update the congregation. Council members discussed the need for the congregation to be kept informed. Discussion on the need for congregational growth was also held. A way to generate more enthusiasm while keeping the congregation informed and involved was discussed.

Pastor's Report. Pastor John presented information on the interview of a candidate for the diaconal position at Mosaic/FOC. Approximation of Family of Christ's financial contribution and term of service was presented and discussed. Motion was made (Pastor John/Tami) to present to the congregation for vote on the terms of diaconal service and FOC's financial obligation. Meeting is scheduled for May 21. Motion carried.

**Ministries Coordinator Report**: Barb Laursen gave a thank you to the parents of confirmation students for helping with the Easter Breakfast. Lunch was served at the community Lenten service on March 31 and on April 27 FOC will serve the Jubilee meal. She thanks the congregation for its support.

Jane reported mutual ministries will meet April 21 at 9:30 a.m.

New and old business: There was no further new or old business. Motion was made (Jane/Lance) to adjourn.

The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Next meeting will be May 9. Respectfully submitted.

(This list is by no means complete ... but maybe you would like to consider trying one of these adventures!)



# PASTORS NOTES

#### HAVING A DEACON INTERN

**First,** let me announce that we are having

### SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING MAY 23<sup>rd</sup>, 9:45 a.m.

Between the services, probably meeting in basement fellowship hall The intent of the meeting is to discuss (and approve) Family of Christ sharing a DEACON INTERN with Mosaic/Bethphage Village within the coming months.

What is a deacon? In our Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, it is a rostered (trained) person committed to Word and Service ministry. Deacons (or deaconesses) are active in church vocation life in areas of teaching and serving. They are frequently supported through congregational connection, but have diverse ways of living out their service: youth work, medical and habilitative care in facilities, teaching in classes. For decades, Bethphage Village was under the care of deaconesses who shared basic care to religious and administrative duties.

#### What would the purpose of an internship be? An intern would

gain valuable experience in work with Mosaic and serving ministries connected with Family of Christ, and

assist in developing stronger congregation ties (Family of Christ and others) with Mosaic ministry

enhance the congregational life of Family of Christ, and give the congregation a variety of leadership assistance

The internship that we are discussing would be 4-6 months in duration, potentially starting as early as June 2017. Warburg Seminary, responsible for this diaconal program, has suggested *Craig Barankiewicz* (pronounced 'Ba-ran-ka-wits') as a prime candidate to accomplish the 700 hours

**240** hours are congregational service

**460** hours are specialization (in this case, with Mosaic)

**PASTOR JOHN** would be supervising pastor on congregational side, with another supervising team of members from Family of Christ and Mosaic. **Family of Christ** would be responsible for (employee) salary for the 240+ hours. This would cover services at Family of Christ and religious services with Bethphage. **Mosaic/Bethphage village** would **hire** Craig as a direct care worker. He would be working 32+ hours per week (at least 460 hours to fulfill the internship requirements).

For Family of Christ, we are looking at a potential of \$4500 for our commitment to the project – the church council has recommended this for congregational decision on May 23rd.

I would be glad to offer more insight on *diaconal work, internship,* and how this can enhance our ministry and work as Family of Christ. In the meantime, thanks for your prayerful consideration of this adventure!
